In November we Remember

Mr Copley led our whole school worship yesterday morning. We heard Sunday's Gospel reading where the poor widow came to the treasury and put in two small coins; the equivalent of a penny. In the eyes of others the offering of the widow was the least, but in the eyes of Jesus it was the greatest. The theme for our worships throughout November will continue to be remembrance

and praying for all those people in our school and parish community who have died.

Mr Copley then told the children a story about the work of the Royal British Legion in helping families who have lost family members to war. We prayed for all those people who have died as a result of war and also for all those people in our lives that have died. If anyone would like to send in a picture of someone close to them who has died we will display these on our display in the hall and remember these people in our thoughts and prayers throughout November. The children



watched a short clip from a recent project undertaken by a couple of artists from Bradford, who along with hundreds of volunteers, created a piece of art work as 9,000 Fallen Soldiers were etched into the sand on Normandy Beach to Commemorate Peace Day. We then sang a new hymn 'We shall go out with hope of resurrection'. Children can continue to make a donation in return for a poppy all this week. As a community we will hold a minutes silence on Wednesday. Our mission for the week was to remember all those who have died and try and give a little bit of time to those who are in need.
