## **Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners**



On Monday Mrs Winnery began Worship by congratulating the Year 3 children that had been presented to the Parish on Sunday as part of their enrolment on the First Holy Communion Programme. She asked the school to keep them in their prayers. Amelia Summers then read the Sunday Gospel where we heard the story of The Wedding Feast at Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle changing water into wine.

Next Mrs Winnery talked to the Children about a very special event in the Catholic Church called the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. This is a Holy Year called by the Church in which we receive a blessing and pardon from God. The jubilee year began on the 8<sup>th</sup> December 2015 and will close on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2016, the Feast of Christ the King.

The Holy Year of Mercy celebrates being a witness of mercy and invites us all to follow the example of God our merciful and forgiving Father. Pope Francis marked the beginning of the year by opening the Holy Door at St Peter's in Rome and during Advent a Holy Door was opened by Bishop Marcus in St Anne's Cathedral



in Leeds. Mrs Winnery told the children that to walk through a Holy Door is a sign that you want to change, to experience God's love and mercy which brings hope and joy.

Mrs Winnery tasked the children with creating Holy Door in school, decorating their doors with words, pictures and symbols that show Jesus' love and mercy. Each class was assigned an act of Mercy and encouraged to find out about a special person or Saint that lived out these acts of Mercy in their daily lives.

To help Mrs Winnery throughout this special year she would like to appoint 'Apostles of Mercy', children willing to give up their time to learn more about God and to help support the Year of Mercy in school. Any children interested are to make themselves known to Mrs Winnery by Friday.

#### **Bad Weather Procedure**

However, because of the very nature of the school site and the surrounding roads, snow and ice are a particular issue and there may be rare occasions when inclement weather may force us to close the school. This is due to health and safety considerations for both the staff and pupils.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, parents will be contacted via text message as soon as possible. Please make sure the school office has your up to date mobile telephone number.

Local radio stations the 'Pulse' and Radio Leeds, the Telegraph and Argus and the Bradford Schools Online website will also have a list of closed schools. - If the school needs to be closed during the day, parents will be contacted by text to request that they pick up their children as soon as possible.

- If you have work commitments please arrange for emergency day care **before** the winter sets in.
