

#### **Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners**

This Monday's Worship focused on the question 'Who am !?' Mrs Winnery explain that this worship was about how each one of us is precious, valuable and unique.



Mrs Winnery invited eight boys and girls to stand in a circle. She gave a ball of wool to Ishaaq and asked him to hold the thread end firmly. Mrs Winnery then asked the children to throw the ball of wool to one another. After a few throws the children had made a web of wool. Mrs Winnery explained that this web showed us that just by being there, each person was playing their part, supporting the others. Just like this web, we are all interconnected. Each one of us is precious and God can see the whole picture, He alone knows how valuable our place is in his creation.

The children then watched a video clip of two parents talking about how they felt before the birth of their child. The children gave some super answers as to why the baby was precious to his parents with

Daijo recognising that the baby was a gift from God.

Mrs Winnery then showed the children a unique handprint and invited them to think about what special qualities they themselves had that they could list on their hand. Some children found this difficult to do and were reluctant to say what made them special so Mrs Winnery encouraged their friends to describe them. Mrs Winnery explained that each person in the world has their own mixture of qualities, likes and dislikes. This special mix makes us who we are: unique, precious and valuable.

In the First Reading from Sunday's Mass we were told that God has known us since before we were born and has a plan for us. Mrs Winnery explained that this meant that God has wanted them from the very beginning of time.

Filip led the closing prayers for the Worship thanking God for making all of us unique. The children were asked to think of two things they could do this week to show to others how unique, valuable and precious they are.

#### **Bad Weather Procedure**



St Cuthbert & The First Martyrs' Catholic Primary School will always endeavour to remain open to educate the children in our care. However, because of the very nature of the school site and the surrounding roads, snow and ice are a particular issue and there may be rare occasions when inclement weather may force us to close the school. This is due to health and safety considerations for both the staff and pupils.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, parents will be contacted via text message as soon as possible. Please make sure the school office has your up to date mobile telephone number.

Local radio stations the 'Pulse' and Radio Leeds, the Telegraph and Argus and the Bradford Schools Online website will also have a list of closed schools. - If the school needs to be closed during the day, parents will be contacted by text to request that they pick up their children as soon as possible.
- It is the parents' responsibility to ensure that they or another carer can get to school to pick up their child/children.
- Parents should inform the office of the person(s) named to collect their child in the event that they cannot get back to school in time.
- If you have work commitments please arrange for emergency day care **before** the winter sets in.
