Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners

This week we will be beginning Lent with Ash Wednesday starting the six-week journey. It doesn't seem such a long time since Christmas, but now we begin to prepare to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord. Let's all try to do what we can during this Year of Mercy to seek God's mercy for ourselves and others in this time of prayer, self denial and charity.

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving can be hard topics to understand – especially for children, so this week in our Monday Worship, Mrs Winnery began with a guided meditation activity. Through using the analogy of a



gardener tending a garden in winter, children were encouraged to see their hearts and souls in a similar way – like gardens that need tending, pruning and feeding so that they were ready for new life to blossom.

During the Worship the children learnt about prayer, fasting and almsgiving and they were encouraged to think of specific ways to take action in these areas during Lent. Kenya will be fasting by giving up drinking tea, Cornelia suggested we raise money by having a fancy dress day and Adam said we could make a special effort to pray before we go to sleep.

During Lent we traditionally raise money for two charities, **The Good Shepherd Appeal** which supports the vital work Catholic Care does with families and children in our own diocese of Leeds, and the work of **Cafod** in the wider world.

To begin our fundraising we will be having a **Crazy Hair Day this Friday 12th February.** The children are being challenged to use their creativity and come to school with the wackiest hairstyles they can design. There will be prizes for the best designs and each child is asked to bring a **£1 donation**.

On **Monday 23rd February** we will be having a special Worship Assembly presented by **Cafod**, where will we be learning about the focus of their work this year and how we can, as a school, support this. As well as whole school events the newly formed Mini Vinnies have asked if their classes can organise events such as a bun sale or an Easter egg raffle. I will be working with the Mini Vinnies to establish a timetable of events so that you have plenty of notice.

Bad Weather Procedure



St Cuthbert & The First Martyrs' Catholic Primary School will always endeavour to remain open to educate the children in our care. However, because of the very nature of the school site and the surrounding roads, snow and ice are a particular issue and there may be rare occasions when inclement weather may force us to close the school. This is due to health and safety considerations for both the staff and pupils.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, parents will be contacted via text message as soon as possible. Please make sure the school office has your up to date mobile telephone number.

Local radio stations the 'Pulse' and Radio Leeds, the Telegraph and Argus and the Bradford Schools Online website will also have a list of closed schools. Further guidance is available on their page: https://bso.bradford.gov.uk/Schools/Home.aspx#schoolclosures

- If the school needs to be closed during the day, parents will be contacted by text to request that they pick up their children as soon as possible.
- It is the parents' responsibility to ensure that they or another carer can get to school to pick up their child/children.
- Parents should inform the office of the person(s) named to collect their child in the event that they cannot get back to school in time.
- If you have work commitments please arrange for emergency day care **before** the winter sets in.
