
#### Through the sign of the cross we follow Jesus

#### **Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners**

On Monday Mrs Winnery introduced Worship by asking the children to share what they knew about sheep and shepherds. The children knew that the shepherd's job was to keep the sheep safe and to make sure they were fed and watered. Mrs Winnery then dressed Dylan as a shepherd and told the children that he was Jesus, 'The Good Shepherd.' Mrs Winnery explained what a good shepherd would do to keep his flock safe and asked Dylan to lie down on the floor guarding his sheep. A good shepherd would become the gatekeeper and put himself physically between the sheep and the wolves that prowled at night in the dark.

Next, Tayyibah read the Sunday Gospel from John where Jesus said "My sheep know my voice and they follow me. I know everyone by name and they can always trust me to take care of them and protect them from harm." The children watched a video clip of a modern day shepherd out on an empty

misty moor calling to his sheep, the video showed that within minutes the shepherd was surrounded by his flock. They had recognised his call and knew he would take care of them.

#### **Year 6 SATs week beginning 9th May**

There is less than a month to go before the SATs. This is the culmination of all their Key Stage 2 teaching not just the teaching of Year 6. It is very important that you ensure that your child completes all their homework. After SATs their homework demands do reduce - the end is in sight.

We try and make it as stress free as possible for all the children and do emphasis that all we want is for each child to do the best they can. The advice below may be of help:

**Attendance**: Make sure your child attends each day during SATs week. The tests have to be taken at a specified time, if your child is away unfortunately for them, and the school, they count as getting a zero.

**Breakfast/Lunch**: Get your child in the habit of taking time for a nutritious breakfast every day. A hungry child is not going to learn well. If they have a packed lunch then make sure they have a well-balanced meal. Year 6 children will be given extra fruit throughout that week as a treat.

**Sleep**: Get your child into a regular sleep routine then stick to it! Most children need ten hours sleep each night. No late night TV or computer games!
