

Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners

Worship began on Monday with the words Jesus said to his disciples at the Last Supper 'Love one another as I have loved you.' Faye read the Sunday Gospel in which we heard Jesus' new

commandment and Mrs Winnery explained to the children that in this worship they were going to imagine what God's perfect love is like.

The children said that God showed his love by always taking care of us, by forgiving us and by loving us so much he died on the cross. Mrs Winnery shared with the children descriptions of God's perfect love, that He loved us unconditionally, always, completely, totally, forever and just the way we are.

Next, the children watched an animated story called 'Bonnie's Brother.' In the story we saw how a family struggled to love one another and how hurt, anger and

an inability to express feelings built a wall between them. The story ended with Bonnie's brother, Ben, running away from home. The children were told that they will learn more about the family next week in our worship.

The children watched and listened very carefully and were able to contribute thoughtfully about what attributes were needed for a loving relationship by looking again at the descriptions of God's love for them. The worship was closed with a prayer that reminded us that love was Jesus' greatest gift and that love alone keeps us together.

Year 6 SATs week beginning 9th May

There is less than two weeks to go before the SATs. This is the culmination of all their Key Stage 2 teaching not just the teaching of Year 6. It is very important that you ensure that your child completes all their homework. After SATs their homework demands do reduce - the end is in sight.

We try and make it as stress free as possible for all the children and do emphasis that all we want is for each child to do the best they can. The advice below may be of help:

Attendance: Make sure your child attends each day during SATs week. The tests have to be taken at a specified time, if your child is away unfortunately for them, and the school, they count as getting a zero.

Breakfast/Lunch: Get your child in the habit of taking time for a nutritious breakfast every day. A hungry child is not going to learn well. If they have a packed lunch then make sure they have a well-balanced meal. Year 6 children will be given extra fruit throughout that week as a treat.

Sleep: Get your child into a regular sleep routine then stick to it! Most children need ten hours sleep each night. No late night TV or computer games!
