



Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners

On Monday morning In Worship Mrs Winnery welcomed the children back to school and shared the Sunday Gospel. We heard the story of the woman who had not always made the right choices. She had shown Jesus that she was sorry for the things she had done by washing his feet with her tears. Finally she covered them with kisses and perfumed oil as a sign of her love. In the Gospel we are told that those around Him were annoyed with her actions and wanted her sent away but Jesus showed her kindness and forgave her sins.

Mrs Winnery talked to the children about the need for kindness and told the children the story of Mother Teresa who had once been challenged by a journalist as to why she bothered working with the poor in Calcutta. The journalist told Mother Teresa her work was just a drop in the ocean because there were millions of poor people in India. Mother Teresa said she was not concerned with a big way of doing things - she was concerned with individuals. "*This person*"





Next Mrs Winnery showed the children a video clip about never underestimating the power of kindness and the difference it can make to other peoples lives. The children saw how loving acts are contagious and how they can carry on with those people who witnessed your kindness. After watching the video the children discussed all the acts of kindness they had seen. The worship ended with Mrs Winnery asking the children to make an extra special effort this half term to be kind to one another and to spend their last few weeks of the school year living a life that makes a difference.
