

# Monday's Worship

In our Gospel worship this week, Mrs Walsh introduced our pupils to the Parable of the Widow and the Judge, which was read by Mia Ogden (Year 6). In the Gospel a widow asks, and keeps asking, an unjust judge to help her get her rights. He eventually relents because she is bothering him so much. Mrs Walsh explained to the children that in this parable, Jesus is saying that God isn't like the unfair judge: He will not just give you your own way if you keep pestering Him, just like when you keep asking your mum for that new toy you want, or another biscuit! But He does listen to you and will answer your prayers quickly if it is His will. You should not give up and prayer is very important. The children were then asked to think about how they prayed. What should they say?

Mrs Walsh told the children about **Teaspoon** prayers. Using the acronym TSP gives us a structure to our prayers:



T is for Thanks: take some time to give thanks to God for all our many blessings - our homes, our families, our friends, our school and all that is good in our lives.

**S is for Sorry**: we need to bring to mind anything we have done wrong, however big or small, and ask for forgiveness.

P is for Please: now is the time when we can ask God for the things we need His help with, knowing that through persistent prayer and His good will, all things are possible.
