Performance Tables 2016

According to the latest performance tables St Cuthbert & The First Martyrs':

- Is the fourth highest performing school, out of 193 schools, in Bradford Local Authority, for the percentage of children achieving the Expected Standard in Reading Writing and Maths.
- With 77% of pupils achieving the Expected Standard in Reading, Writing and Maths this is significantly above the Bradford average (47%) and the national average (53%)
- Is the highest performing school out of the 193 schools in Bradford Local Authority for outcomes in Maths.
- Is the fourth highest performing school out of 193 schools in Bradford Local Authority for outcomes in Reading.
- Is the second highest performing school in the Bradford West area in Reading, Writing and Maths.

This achievement would not have been possible without the hard work, effort and commitment of the children, the high expectations, hard work and dedication of Staff and Governors and the positive relationships and support between home and school. We look forward to continuing our journey together and celebrating excellence in all we do and being outstanding every day.
