Dear Parents, Carers and Parishioners

This weekend marked the great Feast of the Epiphany – the arrival of the wise men to visit Jesus after His birth. In worship last Friday Mr Copley talked to the children about different traditions which take place across the world to celebrate this great feast. We heard about the Eastern European tradition of 'chalking of the doors', the Ukraine tradition of 'blessing the water' and we also watched a video of the huge street processions of the 'Three Kings' in Spain. Some children then 'chalked the doors' around school to bless all the people who enter our school and classrooms. As we move towards the end of Christmastide we are given some wise words and a lovely mission about the Wise Men....

The Wise Men

They are curious. They want to know more. They constantly discover new things What they know does not satisfy them.

They are watchers. Their hearts are awake, attentive. They take the time to understand. They know there is more than the eye can see.

They are travellers. They are not afraid to leave their country, their home, their customs, their ways of doing things. They look beyond their own little world. They travel for a long time. They do not get discouraged.

To meet Jesus, To live with him, We must be like the wise men: - curious about the hearts of others, - attentive to every sign of God, - joyfully moving towards the light.



Mrs Walsh continued this theme in Monday's Gospel worship. Tayyibah in Year 6, Jinos and Nella in Year 4, read aloud the story from St Matthew's Gospel and Mrs Walsh talked about the gifts that were brought to Jesus. The children were encouraged to work out which gifts from Mrs Walsh's bag were suitable for different people, which led onto thinking about the unusual gifts that the wise men offered to Christ. Gold, for a king; Frankincense, to symbolise the healing Jesus would bring; and finally Myrrh, a reference to the significance of Jesus' death. In the hymn, 'In the Bleak Midwinter', the final verse encourages us to think about what we could offer to Jesus:

> What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb. If I were a wise man, I would do my part, Yet what I can I give him; give my heart.

Although we may not have the riches of the wise men, each one of us has something we can offer to Jesus: our hearts and our love, for Him and for one another.

This is due to health and safety considerations for both the staff and pupils.

If the school is closed before the start of the school day, parents will be contacted via text message as soon as possible. Please make sure the school office has your up to date mobile telephone number.
