Worship on Monday began with Mrs Winnery thanking all the children for taking part in our Non Uniform day on Friday in aid of CAFOD, our Lenten charity. Mrs Winnery went on to explain to the children how their donations would be used to help the people in East Africa and make a real difference to the lives of others.

The children watched a short video produced by CAFOD for schools that showed the plight of many people in East Africa, with 16 million people facing starvation. Famine has already been declared in parts of South Sudan. The United Nations warns that the world faces the largest crisis, like this, since 1945. The children found out some of the reasons why this is happening. Poor rainfall has led to drought and harvests have failed. In East Africa, droughts happen more and more often. This means that people have less time to recover between them. In some areas, fighting has driven people from their homes, stopping them from making a living

Mrs Winnery then went onto share the good news. As a school we raised £170 on Friday and the UK Government has promised to match up to £5m of money. The children were then set a maths challenge and given the task of working out how our money might be spent with £25 =One month's special food for a malnourished child, £60 =Clean drinking water for two families for a month and £100 =A week's supplies to a clinic treating children who are malnourished. The children were intrigued by the idea the government would double our contribution and more maths took place! To end our Worship the children sang the hymn 'When I needed a neighbour, were you there' and prayed that we be inspired to share what we had been given so that all children of the world could live their life to the full.

#### School Milk – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### This is the only way to order milk for your child. Payment and orders CANNOT be made to the school office.

From next term the way you order milk for your child will change. You will need to order and pay for milk online through FP School Milk UK Ltd for children aged 5 and above. The process of ordering and paying for your child's milk is quick and easy. Milk for the under-fives is free

until the beginning of the term in which the child turns five. You do not need to order milk for under 5's. Leaflets with full details have been sent out to every child.
